

#### COLLECTS

(BCP) Keep, we beseech thee, O Lord, thy Church with thy perpetual mercy; and, because the frailty of man without thee cannot but fall, keep us ever by thy help from all things hurtful, and lead us to all things profitable to our salvation; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

#### THE END OF A JOURNEY ...

On October 4th, God willing, I shall be ordained deacon by Bishop Richard in Oxford. This is the end of a long journey for me, starting over four years ago when I first spoke to Mike Hill about this and began to feel that God was asking me to take this step. I am being ordained as a Non-Stipendiary (NSM), or, to use the modern jargon, a Minister in Secular Employment (MSE), as I do feel that God wants me to remain in secular employment, and in some ways ordination might seem to be making little difference.

For me, however, ordination is an acceptance of the authority and discipline of the Church - the authority to preach and teach the gospel, and the discipline to do this within the structure of the Church. I am convinced that as Christians we are called to be part of a body, a church, a fellowship of believers. Since New Testament times this is the way the Church has recognised those who serve it in leadership. As far as being an MSE is concerned - well, Paul, the great apostle to the Gentiles, tells us that he still made tents for a living, so that isn't a bad precedent!

It is not always easy to be sure what God is calling us to, not always easy to hear His voice amongst the babble of conflicting thoughts and ideas. Part of my conviction that this is a right step comes from my own listening to God and reading His Word, but part also comes from the reactions and advice of other Christians, from Mike onwards. When we are seeking God's guidance it is important to seek it in the community of the Church, and to hear what God is saying, not just through prayer and Bible study, but through other Christians. The truth that God's Holy Spirit indwells all Christians means that often God can prompt us, to confirm or perhaps deflect decision through our fellow Christians. This is partly why we need to be involved in house groups or prayer triplets or other small fellowship groups with other Christians.

Thank you all for your encouragement and prayers while I have been studying on the Oxford Ministry Course. Please continue to pray for Alison and me as we try to balance up different commitments in the future.
