Memorial Inscriptions of the Parish I

St Leonard's Church & Churchyard

#### PART I - INTERIOR

This transcript was compiled by Colin Mills in the Spring and Summer of 1998. After embarking on the transcript, it was found that the National Association of Decorative and Fine Arts Societies Church Recorder Scheme had conducted a survey some years ago. Details are listed in the bibliography.

#### PART II - CHURCHYARD

This transcript of gravestone inscriptions was compiled by Deborah Read and Colin Mills from a survey of the churchyard in the summer of 1998. Transcripts in the possession of the Bucks Family History Society - where graves were lettered by plot and numbered within plot - and the Bucks Archaeological Society - where graves were numbered - were used to make up where possible any partly or wholly illegible inscriptions.

This is the area on the left hand side of the path to the church main door. It is a small area containing 15 graves, some with footstones, several stones set in the grass, and plaques on the gate and one memorial seat.
